An Act to Amend the Laws Relative to Vesting in the Maine State Retirement System.

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §851, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1993, c. 410, Pt. L, §3-A, is further amended to read:
- 1. Age 60 years; 5 years of creditable service on July 1, 1993. Any member in service may retire on or after the member's 60th birthday. Any member not in service may retire at the age of 60 years or thereafter provided that the member has at least 10 5 years of creditable service or 5 full--terms years as a Legislator. Creditable service as a member of the Maine State Retirement System after service as a member of the Maine Legislative Retirement System is used in determining the completion of 10 5 years of creditable service.
- This subsection applies to members who, on July 1, 1993, have 19
  5 years of creditable service or have reached 60 years of age and
  are in service on that date.
- Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §17851, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1993, c. 410, Pt. L, §34, is further amended to read:
- 2. Member not in service; 5 years of creditable service on 24 July 1, 1993. A member who is not in service when reaching 60 years of age qualifies for a service retirement benefit if the 26 member:
- A. Retires upon or after reaching 60 years of age; and
- B. Has at least 10 5 years of creditable service or 5 full terms years as a Legislator, which may include creditable service as a member of the Maine Legislative Retirement System under Title 3, section 701, subsection 8, before becoming a member of the Maine State Retirement System.
- This subsection applies to members who, on July 1, 1993, have 10 36 5 years of creditable service. For the purpose of calculating creditable service under this subsection only, creditable service 38 includes time during which a member participated in the voluntary cost savings plan or the voluntary employee incentive program, 40 authorized by Public Law 1989, chapter 702, Part F, section F-6 6 and Public Law 1991, chapter 591, Part BB and chapter 780, Part 42 VV, or 19 5 years of combined creditable service under this Part 44 and Title 3, chapter 29, or creditable service available to a member that the member was eligible to purchase on June 30, 1993 and that the member does purchase in accordance with rules 46 adopted by the board.

This bill lowers the vesting period from 10 to 5 years for state employees, teachers and Legislators who were not in service on July 1, 1993 and had at least 5 years of creditable service.
