	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

10	Sec. 2. 29-A MRSA §1766, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1997, c. 786, §6 and affected by §14, is further amended to read:
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14	3. Fee. Stickers are furnished by the Chief of the State Police at \$1.50 each. <u>Fifty cents of the revenue collected from</u> each sticker furnished by the Chief of the State Police must be
16	deposited into a nonlapsing, dedicated account. Revenue deposited into this account must be used to fund the motor
18	vehicle inspection program within the Department of Public Safety and the Safety Inspection Advisory Board.
20	Sec. 3. 29-A MRSA §1766-A is enacted to read:
22	§1766-A. Safety Inspection Advisory Board
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26	The Safety Inspection Advisory Board, as authorized by Title 5, section 12004-I, subsection 74-D, is advisory to the commissioner. The board consists of 5 members to be appointed by
28	the Chief of the State Police: one member from an association that provides automobile services, one member from an association
30	of new car dealers, one member from the automobile service sector, one member from the service department of an automobile
32	dealership and one member from the State Police. The board members serve at the pleasure of the Chief of the State Police
34	and are entitled to compensation in accordance with Title 5, chapter 379. The board shall stimulate active support for
36	vehicle safety and vehicle safety inspection programs and advise the Department of Public Safety regarding these issues. The
38	board shall report annually its findings and recommendations, including any necessary implementing legislation, to the
40	commissioner and to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters.
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44	SUMMARY
46	This bill establishes that additional Highway Fund revenue collected from an increase in automobile inspection fees enacted
48	in the last legislative session will be dedicated to the motor vehicle inspection program within the Department of Public Safety
50	and to the Safety Inspection Advisory Board, which is established by this bill.
