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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT 'H' to H.P. 226, L.D. 304

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Whereas, the Legislature has determined that these service center communities and other locally designated growth areas not only are essential to the economic health of the State but also can play important roles in the efficient delivery of state, local and regional services; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Task force created. Resolved: That, because community service centers and other locally designated growth areas in 8 Maine are vital to job creation and the delivery of critical services, the Task Force on State Office Building Location and 10 Other State Growth-related Capital Investments, referred to in this resolve as the "task force," is created to assess the impact 12 of state office buildings in downtown service centers within service center communities and of 14 regional other state growth-related capital investments in other locally designated 16 growth areas and to recommend ways to ensure continued location of state office buildings within both those service center 18 communities and their traditional downtown service centers and to ensure that other state growth-related capital investments are made in areas designated for growth by municipalities in their 20 comprehensive plans; and be it further 22

Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the task force consists of the following 11 members:

26 1. Three members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate;

Four members of the House of Representatives appointed
 by the Speaker of the House;

32 3. The Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services or the commissioner's designee;

A representative from a department or agency of Federal
 Government invited jointly by the President of the Senate and the
 Speaker of the House;

5. The Commissioner of Economic and Community Development 40 or the commissioner's designee; and

42 6. The Director of the State Planning Office within the Executive Department or the director's designee; and be it further

Sec. 3. Appointments. Resolved: That appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council upon making their appointments; and be it further

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Sec. 4. Chairs. Resolved: That the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House shall each appoint from among the members of the task force a cochair of the task force within 30 days of the effective date of this resolve; and be it further

6 Sec. 5. Meetings and working groups. Resolved: That the cochairs of the task force shall call and convene the first 8 meeting of the task force within 30 days of the date that the last member is appointed. The task force shall form advisory 10 working groups from among affected agencies, trade organizations and the public to help carry out the task force's 12 responsibilities; and be it further

14 Sec. 6. Compensation. Resolved: That legislative members are entitled to receive the legislative per diem and reimbursement of 16 necessary expenses for their attendance at authorized meetings of the task force; and be it further

Sec. 7. Staff. Resolved: That upon approval of the Legislative Council the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the task force; and be it further

Sec. 8. Duties. Resolved: That the task force shall consider in its assessments and recommendations the conclusions and recommendations of the Task Force on Regional Service Center Communities contained in its report, "Reviving Service Centers" (State Planning Office, September, 1998) and the concepts contained in Legislative Document 1080 and Legislative Document 1414, which were presented to the First Regular Session of the 119th Legislature. The task force shall:

Assess the role of state office buildings in the continued viability of downtown service centers within the State
 and the impact of other state growth-related capital investments within and outside of locally designated growth areas;

Analyze recent trends in relocating state and federal
 agency offices from downtown service centers to commercial strips
 and from service centers to suburban communities and in the
 location of other state growth-related capital investments
 outside of locally designated growth areas;

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3. Assess how other states have responded to these trends;

Recommend appropriate legislation to ensure that state 4. 46 offices continue to enhance the historic role of downtowns within the State's regional service centers and that state 48 growth-related capital investments are made in manner а

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consistent with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, sections 2 4312 and 4326; and

4 5. Review and make recommendations on other directly related matters the task force considers necessary; and be it further

8 Sec. 9. Report. Resolved: That no later than February 15, 2000 the task force shall submit a report that includes its 10 findings to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government as well as any recommended legislation to the Second 12 Regular Session of the 119th Legislature; and be it further

14 Sec. 10. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.

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additional General Fund This resolve includes an appropriation of \$4,175 in fiscal year 1999-00 for the 2 Legislature for the per diem and expenses of legislative members for 5 meetings of the Task Force on State Office Building 4 Location and Other State Growth-Related Capital Investments and 6 to print the required report.

8 The additional costs associated with providing staffing assistance to the task force during the interim between 10 legislative sessions can be absorbed by the Legislature utilizing existing budgeted resources. If the task force requires staffing 12 assistance during the legislative session, the Legislature may require an additional General Fund appropriation to contract for 14 staff services.

16 The additional costs associated with serving on the task force can be absorbed by the Department of Administrative and 18 Financial Services, the Department of Economic and Community Development and the Executive Department, State Planning Office 20 utilizing existing budgeted resources.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment renames the resolve and the task force 26 created by the resolve and expands the task force's duties to include growth-related capital investment within and outside areas that have been designated by municipalities for growth and 28 redevelopment. It also expands task force membership and allows 30 the task force to establish working groups to help it carry out The amendment also instructs the task force to its duties. 32 consider the concepts contained within other related legislation presented to the 119th Legislature and to assess the impact of 34 growth-related capital investments within and outside of locally designated growth areas. It also adds an appropriation of \$4,175 36 to cover the costs of the task force and adds a fiscal note.

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
