## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6024, sub-§1-A, as amended by PL 1995, c. 382, §2, is further amended to read:
- Appointment; composition; term; compensation. The 6 1-A. Marine Resources Advisory Council, established by Title 5, section 12004-G, subsection 27, consists of 15 17 members. The 8 Chair of the Lobster Advisory Council is-an and the chair of the Recreational Marine Advisory Council or a successor organization 10 established by the Governor, are ex officio member members of the 12 council. Each other member is appointed by the Governor and is subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over marine resources and to 14 confirmation by the Legislature. Seven members must be persons 16 are licensed under this Part to engage in commercial who Those 7 members are selected by the harvesting activities. 18 Governor from names recommended to the Governor by groups representing commercial harvesting interests. Each member must represent a different commercial harvesting activity, except that 20 none of those 7 members may represent lobster harvesters. The remaining 7 8 members must include one person who represents the 22 interests of those who charter their boats for recreational 24 purposes, one person who represents recreational marine fishing member, 4 who interests, one public persons holđ а nonharvesting-related license under this Part and one person 26 representing the aquaculture industry. The Governor shall select 28 the person to represent the aquaculture industry from among the names recommended by the aquaculture industry. The composition 30 of the council must reflect a geographical distribution along the All appointed members are appointed for a term of 3 coast. years, except a vacancy must be filled in the same manner as an 32 original member for the unexpired portion of the term. An 34 appointed member may not serve for more than 2 consecutive terms. Appointed members serve until their successors are The Chair of the Lobster Advisory Council and the 36 appointed. chair of the Recreational Marine Advisory Council shall serve 38 until a new Chair of the Lobster Advisory Council or a new chair of the Recreational Marine Advisory Council, respectively, is chosen. Members are compensated as provided in Title 5, chapter 40 379.

## **SUMMARY**

46 This bill expands the Marine Resources Advisory Council from 15 to 17 members by making the chair of the Recreational Marine 48 Advisory Council an ex officio member and by adding a member who represents the charter boat industry.
