COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 232, L.D. 336, Bill, "An Act Regarding Exhibition of Licenses from the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife"

Amend the bill in section 1 in the 2nd line (page 1, line 5 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "~~§7909-C.~~" and inserting in its place the following: '§7079-C.'

Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "~~§7909-C.~~" in subsection 2, in the 2nd line (page 1, line 15 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "permit" the following 'for inspection'

Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "~~§7909-C.~~" in subsection 2, in the 3rd line (page 1, line 16 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "department" the following ', a registered Maine guide'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

FISCAL NOTE

This bill may increase prosecutions for Class E crimes. If a jail sentence is imposed, the additional costs to the counties are estimated to be \$82.48 per day per prisoner. These costs are not reimbursed by the State. The number of prosecutions that may result in a jail sentence and the resulting costs to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

14 must be exhibited for inspection and also allows registered Maine
guides to inspect hunting or fishing licenses.

 This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
