Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

3 **Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §1759, sub-§1**, as enacted by PL 1993, c.
4 683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read:

7 **1. Issuance.** A law enforcement officer, permit-certified
8 police dispatcher or employee of the Bureau of Motor Vehicles
9 designated by the Secretary of State may issue a permit allowing
10 operation of an uninspected vehicle to an inspection station for
11 inspection. For purposes of this subsection, a "permit-certified
12 police dispatcher" means a police dispatcher who is certified by
13 a municipal police department to issue permits pursuant to this
14 subsection.

19 This bill adds permit-certified police dispatchers to the
20 list of people authorized to issue temporary permits allowing
operation of uninspected vehicles to an inspection station.
