SUMMARY

This amendment provides for an increase in the minimum wage to \$5.75 per hour beginning January 1, 2001 and to \$6.25 per hour beginning January 1, 2002. It also amends the referendum question to reflect these changes and adds an appropriation section and fiscal note to the bill.
