An Act Raising the Minimum Wage.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §664, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 305, §1, is amended to read:

- 1. Minimum wage. The minimum hourly wage is \$4.25 per If-the-highest-federal-minimum-wage-is-increased-in-excess ef-\$4,25-per-hour,-the-minimum-wage-must-be-increased-to-the-same amount, -effective-on-the-same date as the increase in the federal 10 minimum-waqe,-but-in-no-case-may-the-minimum-waqe-exceed-\$5.15 per-heur- Starting January 1, 2000, the minimum hourly wage is \$5.50 per hour. Starting January 1, 2001, the minimum hourly 12 wage is \$6.00 per hour. Starting January 1, 2002, and each 14 January 1st thereafter, the director shall automatically adjust the minimum hourly wage by any percentage change in the Consumer 16 Price Index. For the purposes of this subsection "Consumer Price Index" has the meaning set forth in Title 36, section 5402, 18 subsection 1.
 - Sec. 2. Referendum for ratification; submission at statewide election; form of question; effective date. This Act must be submitted to the legal voters of the State of Maine at a statewide election held on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following passage of this Act. The municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, to vote on the acceptance or rejection of this Act by voting on the following question:
 - "Do you favor raising the minimum wage to \$5.50 per hour in 2000 and \$6.00 per hour in 2001 and thereafter adjusting it by the Consumer Price Index?"
- 34 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice 36 by a cross or check mark placed within a corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, 38 sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same 40 manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of 42 the legal votes are cast in favor of the Act, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay, and the Act takes effect 30 44 days after the date of the proclamation.
- The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this Act necessary to carry out the purpose of this referendum.

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SUMMARY

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This bill raises the minimum wage to \$5.50 per hour starting January 1, 2000 and \$6.00 per hour starting January 1, 2001. Starting January 1, 2002, and annually thereafter, the Director of the Bureau of Labor Standards will automatically adjust the minimum wage by the 12-month averaged percentage change in the Consumer Price Index. The bill includes a referendum provision.
