8	1. Certification required. The following certification requirements apply.
10	A. An on-premise server who works in an establishment licensed under chapter 43 shall complete, within one year of
12	employment as a server, an alcohol server education course that is certified by the commissioner.

16	B. A seasonal on-premise server who works in an establishment licensed under chapter 43 shall complete, within 2 years of employment as a server, an alcohol server
18	education course that is certified by the commissioner.

4	3. Advisory committee; course criteria. The advisory
6	committee shall determine specific criteria which that an alcohol server education course must contain to receive approval
8	<u>certification</u> . The specific criteria shall <u>must</u> be based on and include the following.
10	A. The instructors of the program <u>must</u> possess the relevant skills to provide instruction.

- 4. Advisory committee; review and recommendation. The advisory committee shall review each alcohol server education course submitted to the commissioner and recommend that the commissioner either appreve certify or not appreve certify the course based on whether the course meets the criteria the advisory committee developed under subsection 3.
- Sec. 7. 28-A MRSA §2519, sub-§§6 and 7, as amended by PL 1997, c. 373, §168, are further amended to read:

6. Instructor training. Each instructor providing instruction in an-approved a certified alcohol server education course must be certified by the bureau. To receive certification, an instructor shall biennially attend a seminar on the liquor laws of the State provided by an employee of the bureau. There is a \$5 fee for the seminar to offset expenses incurred in carrying out this subsection. The instructor of each course provided shall supply the bureau with the name, address and telephone number of each attendant.

7. Course accountability. The chief may appoint an employee of the bureau to monitor each alcohol server education course to ensure that the course presents proper training and meets the approved criteria. The bureau shall maintain a record of the participants who have completed an a certified alcohol server training course. Each instructor of an-approved certified course shall provide the chief with the names, addresses, dates of birth and social security numbers of students who complete the course and the date of completion. The instructors shall forward \$3 of the enrollment fee to the bureau for every name submitted. The amounts collected must be retained by the bureau to cover costs incurred in carrying out this subsection.

Sec. 8. 28-A MRSA §2519, sub-§8, as amended by PL 1997, c. 373, §169, is further amended to read:

8. Alcohol server education courses; approval; suspension; revocation. The commissioner may refuse to issue or renew appreval certification for an alcohol server education course. The commissioner may suspend or revoke appreval certification for an alcohol server education course upon the recommendation of the advisory committee after reviewing the a report of the monitor. The following are grounds for an action to refuse to issue or

2	renew appreval certification or to suspend or revoke appreval certification.
4	A. The advisory committee finds that an alcohol server
6	education course does not meet the criteria listed in subsection 3 or specific criteria determined by the committee.

10	B. The course, when presented, does not follow specific criteria determined by the advisory committee before issuance of approval certification.
12	C. The instructor of the course does not provide

44	SUMMARY
46	This bill requires all on-premise alcohol servers to
48	complete a certified alcohol server education course. Alcohol
50	server education courses must be certified by the Commissioner of Public Safety. Instructors who teach alcohol server education

- courses must be certified by the Bureau of Liquor Enforcement.
- The bill also prohibits licensees who serve liquor on the premises from employing servers who have not completed a
- 4 certified alcohol server education course.
