Resolved: That the task force shall submit its report, together with any recommended implementing 4 legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government no later than November 1, 2000. If the task force 6 requires an extension of time to complete its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension; 8 and be it further

10 Sec. 9. Task force budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the task force, with assistance from the task force staff, shall administer the task force's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the task force shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The task force may not incur expenses that would result in the task 16 force exceeding its approved budget.

 18 Upon request from the task force, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council or the Executive Director's designee
20 shall promptly provide the task force chair and staff with a status report on the task force budget, expenditures incurred and

preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.' 4 Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following: 6 8 'FISCAL NOTE 10 2000-01 12 **APPROPRIATIONS/ALLOCATIONS** 14 \$5,750 General Fund 16 This resolve includes a General Fund appropriation of \$5,750 18 in fiscal year 2000-01 for the Legislature for the per diem and expenses of legislative members of the Task Force to Implement 20 the 1991 Report of the President's and Speaker's Blue Ribbon Commission on Children and Families and to print the required 22 report. 24 The additional costs associated with providing staffing assistance to the task force during the interim between legislative sessions can be absorbed by the Legislature utilizing 26 existing budgeted resources. If an extension of the reporting 28 deadline is granted and the task force requires staffing assistance during the legislative session, the Legislature may 30 require an additional General Fund appropriation to contract for staff services.' 32 SUMMARY 34 36 This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve that creates the Task Force to Implement the 1991 Report of the President's 38 and Speaker's Blue Ribbon Commission on Children and Families. The task force's membership consists of the Speaker of the House, 40 the President of the Senate and the House and Senate majority and minority leaders. The task force is required to report by November 1, 2000. 42 44 The amendment also adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the bill. 46
