Preamble. Whereas, significant quantities of pharmaceuticals are used in the treatment of geriatric residents in long-term care settings; and

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Whereas, it is important to the residents and to the State that pharmaceuticals are used properly and economically; and

Whereas, quidelines for the use of pharmaceuticals for patients can assist administrators providers in making decisions about pharmaceuticals for that 10 population; now, therefore, be it

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- Sec. 1. Study group to develop and recommend guidelines for use of pharmaceuticals. Resolved: That the Department of Human Services shall form a study group to develop and recommend guidelines for the use of pharmaceuticals to treat geriatric patients. group must include physicians, medical administrators, nurses and consultant pharmacists who practice in long-term care facilities. The purpose of the guidelines is to enhance the ability of health care practitioners to provide appropriate drug therapy in the most cost-effective manner. study group shall review existing pharmaceutical care guidelines in other states and Canada in formulating the quidelines; and be it further
- Sec. 2. Department of Human Services to provide staffing. Resolved: That the Department of Human Services shall provide staff assistance to the study group. The study group may meet as often as it considers necessary to perform its duties. The study group shall solicit input from interested parties; and be it further

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Sec. 3. Guidelines to be developed by March 1, 2000. Resolved: That the study group shall develop the quidelines by March 1, 2000 and shall present a copy of the guidelines to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services. The study group shall also disseminate and encourage use of the guidelines to administrators and service providers who work with geriatric patients.
