	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7202, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 420,
4	\$1, is amended to read:
6	1. Issuance. The commissioner may grant permits to introduce, import or transport any live freshwater fish or eggs
8	gametes into the State or to receive or have in possession fish or eggs gametes so introduced, imported or transported if the
10 12	commissioner determines that the species does not pose a significant risk to the health, habitat or genetic integrity of any native species of fish or other organisms.

20	C. A statement from a recognized fish pathologist, from a college or university, from a state conservation department or from the United States Fish and Wildlife Service,

36	3. Rules. The commissioner may adopt rules allowing the importation of certain species of tropical fish and goldfish

46	SUMMARY

This bill will clarify the authority of the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to deny an importation permit if it

is determined that the species poses a significant risk to the health, habitat or genetic integrity of any native species of fish or other organisms.
