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46	The purpose of the inspections shallbe is to reevaluate and ascertain the downstream hazard classification of each dam.	
48	2. Hazard classification. Each dam inspected under this	
50	section shall <u>must</u> be classified pursuant to the hazard potential of the dam. The principal criterion used to determine the hazard	
52	classification of the dam shall <u>must</u> be the potential risk to public safety and property downstream of the dam which <u>that</u> may	
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be affected directly or indirectly by the failure of the dam.
2 The standards of classification of dams shall must be the same as those adopted by the United States Army Corps of Engineers, as
4 set forth in 33 Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter II, and all subsequent amendments thereto.

3. Report. A state dam inspector shall write and issue a 8 report making a recommendation regarding the classification of each dam to the director. A copy of the report shall must be provided to the dam owner of record and forwarded by certified 10 mail. The dam owner shall notify the agency within 30 days of receipt of the report if the owner disagrees with the conclusions 12 of the State's classification recommendation. If the owner of 14 the dam does not agree with the results and recommendations of the dam inspector, the owner may at the owner's expense have a 16 professional engineer registered conduct an independent investigation to determine the hazard classification of the dam. 18 The dam owner shall provide the results of this independent investigation to the director within 6 months of receipt of the 20 original report. The owner may apply for and be granted an extension of this deadline by the director for good cause. Ά 22 state dam inspector shall review and consider the information provided by the owner's report pertaining to the classification of the dam and may issue a new classification recommendation. 24 After reviewing all available data, the director shall then 26 determine the classification of the dam.

- 28 The director shall reevaluate the hazard classification of a dam at-least-once-every-6-years on the following schedule and, if 30 necessary, reclassify the dam to account for the possibility that conditions downstream of the dam may have changed:
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A. At least once every 6 years; and

B. Within 30 days of receiving a notice of transfer of ownership of a high or significant hazard dam pursuant to section 1071, unless the hazard classification has been evaluated within 4 years preceding the proposed transfer.

40 4. Ascertain conditions of dam. A state dam inspector shall also conduct on-site inspections of the dams inspected 42 under subsection 1 to determine if the integrity, structural stability and function of the dams constitute a threat to public safety downstream of the dams. A state dam inspector shall issue 44 a report on the material condition of each dam which-shall that must describe in detail any material condition which that 46 constitutes a threat to public safety. The engineering process, mathematical calculations and complete documentation justifying 48 the assessment of the current material condition shall must be 50 provided to the director. The director shall conduct on-site

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structural stability inspections of all dams in the State 2 classified as high or significant hazard dams on the following schedule: 4 A. At least once every 6 years; and 6 B. Within 30 days of receiving a notice of transfer of ownership of a high or significant hazard dam pursuant to 8 section 1071, unless the hazard classification has been 10 evaluated within 4 years preceding the proposed transfer. 12 Correction of unsafe conditions. After receiving a 5. report on a dam from a state dam inspector, if the director 14 determines that a dam is an imminent threat to the safety of the public, the director may order the owners, lessees or persons in control of the dam to make alterations to the dam or its 16 operations, including, but not limited to: 18 A. Breach or removal of the dam: 20 B. Repair or maintenance of the dam; 22 C. Operation of the dam in a specified manner; 24 Preparation of and adherence to an emergency operations D. 26 plan satisfactory to the agency; or 28 Ε. Maintenance of appropriate records relating to water levels, dam operation and dam maintenance. 30 When the director issues an order under this subsection, the 32 director shall ensure that a state dam inspector is available to provide technical assistance to the owners, lessees or persons in 34 control of the dam and to the municipality in which the dam is located. 36 6. Inspection costs of transferred dam. If the inspection 38 of a dam is conducted as a result of a transfer of ownership of a high or significant hazard dam and the agency is required to 40 incur additional inspection costs in order to meet the inspection deadlines pursuant to this section, the owners, lessees or 42 persons in control of the dam are responsible for any additional inspection costs incurred by the agency in conducting the 44 inspection of the dam or reevaluating the hazard classification of the dam. 46

Sec. 2. 37-B MRSA §1071 is enacted to read:

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2 §1071. Notice of transfer of ownership

4 Forty-five days prior to any change of ownership of a dam, whether by sale, lease or gift, the owner or owners of a dam б classified as a high or significant hazard dam shall provide the name and address of the prospective new owner or owners to the 8 director along with any plan that the prospective new owner has with regard to maintaining competent operations and correcting any unsafe conditions. For purposes of this section, "competent 10 operations" means properly and safely maintaining the dam and ensuring compliance with all safety, environmental and water 12 level rules or orders. 14

Sec. 3. Notice of revised inspection requirements. The Maine Emergency Management Agency shall provide notice of revised inspection requirements to all owners of dams classified as high or significant hazard dams within 30 days of the effective date of this Act.'

- 22 Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:
 - 'FISCAL NOTE

28 The Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management will incur some minor additional costs to administer certain dam 30 inspection requirements. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

36 This amendment replaces the original bill and requires new owners of a dam classified as a high or significant hazard dam to 38 provide the Director of the Maine Emergency Management Agency with the name and address of the new owner or owners 45 days 40 prior to any change of ownership of the dam, along with a copy of the new owner's plan to operate the dam. This amendment also requires the director to conduct a hazard examination and an 42 on-site structural stability inspection of a high or significant 44 hazard dam in the State within 30 days of receiving notice of the change of ownership of the dam, unless the dam has been inspected within 4 years preceding the date of transfer. Finally, the 46 amendment makes dam owners responsible for any inspection fees incurred by the Maine Emergency Management Agency in connection 48 with an inspection relating to a transfer of ownership. 50

This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
