Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 **Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §13702, sub-§10, ¶A**, as enacted by PL 1987, c.
4 710, §5, is amended to read:

6 A. Any pharmacy located in a retail store, mail order
8 business, free clinic or rural health center with facilities
10 located in this State which is engaged in dispensing,
12 delivering or distributing prescription drugs; or

14 **Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §13702, sub-§10-A** is enacted to read:

16 10-A. Free clinic. "Free clinic" means an incorporated
18 nonprofit health facility that provides health care to people at
20 no charge.

22 **Sec. 3. 32 MRSA §13723, sub-§11** is enacted to read:

24 11. Exemption. A free clinic is exempt from all fees
26 required under this chapter.

28 **Sec. 4. 32 MRSA §13751, sub-§2, ¶C and D**, as enacted by PL
30 1987, c. 710, §5, are amended to read:

32 C. Wholesale drug outlet; or

34 D. Rural health center; or

36 **Sec. 5. 32 MRSA §13751, sub-§2, ¶E** is enacted to read:

38 E. Free clinic.

SUMMARY

36 This bill amends the Maine Pharmacy Act by including a free
38 clinic in the definition for drug outlet. The bill also exempts
free clinics from registration fees currently required under the
Maine Pharmacy Act.
