An Act to Require Resident Moose Lottery Applicants to Hold Big Game Hunting Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7463-A, sub-§6, as amended by PL 1997, c. 24, Pt. I, $\S3$, is further amended to read: 4 Application procedure. б 6. Eligible persons wishing to apply for a permit must file a written application for a permit 8 on a form furnished by the commissioner. Applicants who are residents of the State must possess a valid big game hunting 10 license. The application fee may not be refunded. A person may not file more than one application. Any person who submits more 12 than one application is disgualified from the selection of permittees. The application must be accompanied by an 14 application fee of: 16 A. For residents: 18 (1) Five dollars for a one-chance application; 20 (2) Ten dollars for a 3-chance application---A resident-must-possess-a-valid-big-game-hunting-license 22 to-be-eligible-to-purchase -a -3-chance -applieation - and; or 24 (3) Twenty dollars for a 6-chance application----A 26 resident-must--possess--a-valid-big-game-hunting-license to-be-eligible-to-purchase-a-6-chance-application; or 28 B. For nonresidents: 30 (1) Ten dollars for a one-chance application; 32 (2) Twenty dollars for a 3-chance application; and or 34 (3) Thirty dollars for a 6-chance application. 36 **SUMMARY** 38 40 This bill requires residents of this State to possess a valid big game hunting license before entering the moose lottery.
