Resolve, Creating the Commission to Study Economic Development Opportunities for Lewiston and Auburn.

Preamble. Whereas, the neighboring cities of Lewiston and Auburn represent the 2nd most populous urban area in the State and, as such, their continued economic health is vital to the entire State: and Whereas, the cities of Lewiston and Auburn have unique social, cultural and economic assets and liabilities; and 8 Whereas, urban sprawl and local land use policies may have 10 development impact on economic growth and Lewiston-Auburn area; and 12 Whereas. current economic growth and development activities, including those already undertaken by the Lewiston 14 and Auburn municipal governments and regional organizations, need 16 to be assessed; and 18 Whereas. short-term and long-term opportunities economic growth and development within the cities of Lewiston and 20 Auburn need to be identified and acted upon to help the cities maintain and enhance their economic health; now, therefore, be it 22 Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission 24 to Study Economic Development Opportunities for Lewiston and Auburn, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is 26 established; and be it further Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission 28 consists of 13 members appointed as follows: 30 1. Two members of the House of Representatives who also serve on the Joint Standing Committee on Business and Economic 32 Development, appointed by the Speaker of the House upon the 34 recommendation of the committee cochairs; One member of the Senate who also serves on the Joint 36 Standing Committee on Business and Economic Development, appointed by the President of the Senate upon recommendation the 38 of the committee cochairs; 40 One member from the Joint Standing Committee 42 Appropriations and Financial Affairs or the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation, appointed by the Speaker of the House upon 44 the recommendation of the committee cochairs;

46 4. Two members of the Legislature from Androscoggin County, appointed by the President of the Senate;

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5. One representative of Androscoggin County government, appointed by the Speaker of the House upon the recommendation of the chair of the Androscoggin County Commissioners;

- 2 6. One representative of the Department of Economic and Community Development, appointed by the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development;
- 7. One member of the Lewiston City Council, appointed by the Speaker of the House upon the recommendation of the Lewiston City Council chair;
- 8. One member of the Auburn City Council, appointed by the President of the Senate upon the recommendation of the Auburn City Council chair;
- 9. One representative of the Androscoggin County Chamber of Commerce, appointed by the Speaker of the House upon the recommendation of the Androscoggin County Chamber of Commerce president;
- 10. One business owner from Lewiston, appointed by the 20 President of the Senate upon the recommendation of the chair of the Lewiston City Council; and

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- 11. One business owner from Auburn, appointed by the Speaker of the House upon the recommendation of the chair of the Auburn City Council.
  - All appointments must be made no later than 30 following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council upon making their appointments. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall contact appointing authorities who have not made their appointments as of the required date; and be it further
    - Sec. 3. Convening. Resolved: That the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call the commission together for its first meeting no later than 45 days after the effective date of this resolve. If the first meeting is not called within the assigned time, the Governor shall call the first meeting for a date no later than 10 days after the initially required date. It is not necessary for all members to be appointed in order for the commission to meet. A quorum consists of a majority of those appointed; and be it further
    - Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study economic development opportunities for the cities of Lewiston and Auburn. In examining these issues, the commission shall:
- 1. Assess the economic assets and liabilities unique to the cities of Lewiston and Auburn;

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	Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the commission shall
14	request staffing assistance from the Legislative Council; and be
	it further
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	Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved: That all members of the
18	commission are entitled to reimbursement for travel and other
	necessary expenses. The Executive Director of the Legislative
20	Council shall administer the commission's budget; and be it
	further
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	Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit
24	its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation,
	to the Second Regular Session of the 119th Legislature no later
26	than February 1, 2000. If the commission requires an extension,
	it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the
28	extension.
