	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
4	as emergencies; and  Whereas, the Town of Gorham has a number of private wells
6	which are contaminated by highway construction activity; and
8	Whereas, water mains need to be extended to bring drinkable water to certain residents; and

12	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
14	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

18	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
20	Sec. 1. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from the Highway Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
