	This bill grants the Public Utilities Commission limited
36	jurisdiction over radio paging and mobile telecommunications
38	services. It requires radio paging and mobile telecommunication service providers to comply with any central office code
	conservation measures adopted by the commission that may be
40	necessary to prevent or delay the adoption of a 2nd area code for the State. The bill also clarifies the commission's jurisdiction

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to require mobile telecommunications service providers to participate in state universal service efforts, including assessments toward a state universal service fund.
