not reimbursed by the State. The number of prosecutions that may 2 result in a jail sentence and the resulting costs to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

The additional workload, administrative costs and indigent defense costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

SUMMARY

The amendment replaces and retitles the bill. The amendment 16 clarifies that "private place" for purposes of the crime of violation of privacy includes changing or dressing rooms, 18 bathrooms and similar places. The amendment also adds a fiscal note.
