	Beginning January 1, 2000, a person appointed to perform the

statewide association of harbor masters.

SUMMARY

This bill requires, beginning January 1, 2000, that a harbor master complete a harbor master training course certified by a statewide association of harbor masters within one year of appointment as harbor master.
