Sec. 1. Authorization to sue the State. Resolved: That, notwithstanding any statute or common law to the contrary, Robert Gray, or his legal representative, is authorized to bring a civil action against the State of Maine in order to investigate alleged errors made by state officials that caused children to believe they had been victims of a crime.

This action may be brought in the Waldo County Superior Court within one year from the date this resolve is approved. The action may be heard by a Justice of the Superior Court or by a jury. The Maine Rules of Civil Procedure govern the conduct of the action. The Attorney General shall appear, answer and defend the action; and be it further

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Sec. 2. Release of documents. Resolved: That, notwithstanding any statute or common law to the contrary, confidential records pertaining to Robert Gray's claim in section 1, including handwritten notes and reports developed by the following State Police Detective Barry Hathaway, Penobscot officials: District Attorney R. Christopher Almy, Sagadahoc County District Attorney Geoffrey A. Rushlau and Victim Witness Coordinator Gail D'Agostino, be released Robert Gray or his to representative; and be it further

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Sec. 3. Release of video. Resolved: That a copy of the 1988 and 1989 State Police television special that depicted Detective Barry Hathaway as a special child abuse investigator be released to Robert Gray or his legal representative; and be it further

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Sec. 4. Review of employment file. Resolved: That information regarding public complaints and how the complaints were handled by internal affairs within the Maine State Police that is contained in Detective Barry Hathaway's employment file prior to May 1987 be released to Robert Gray or his legal representative.

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## **SUMMARY**

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This resolve authorizes Robert Gray to sue the State. The resolve also authorizes the release of certain confidential information pertaining to Robert Gray's claim that errors made by state officials caused children to believe that they had been victims of a crime.
