28	Sec. UUU-1. 22 MRSA §§258 and 259 are enacted to read:
30	§258. Office of Eating Disorders
32	There is established within the Bureau of Health, the Office of Eating Disorders, referred to in this section as the
34	"office." The office is responsible for researching, planning, facilitating, coordinating and developing information and
36	resources on eating disorders statewide.
38	<b>1. Duties.</b> The office shall conduct a comprehensive needs assessment to identify unmet prevention needs and shall oversee
40	the assessment of training programs conducted under subsection 2. The office shall compile and disseminate to the public
42	information on eating disorders and coordinate the advertisement and promotion of programs aimed at the prevention and treatment
44	of eating disorders.

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	1. Membership. The board consists of:

40	of the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and
42	Substance Abuse Services and one representative of the
42	Department of Education, each of whom is appointed by the
44	commissioner of that person's department and all of whom
44	serve ex officio and without the authority to vote; and

### **FISCAL NOTE**

This amendment will increase the General Fund cost of the bill by \$44,643 in fiscal year 1999-00 and \$53,427 in fiscal year 2000-01.

#### **SUMMARY**

24 This amendment contains provisions to implement the recommendations of the Commission on Eating Disorders. It 26 includes establishing an Office of Eating Disorders in the Department of Human Services, establishing an Eating Disorders 28 Advisory Board and requiring a report from the Office of Eating Disorders by February 1, 2000 to the Joint Standing Committee on 30 Health and Human Services on laws to regulate businesses that sell products or services promoting weight loss. This bill 32 contains an appropriation for one position within the Office of Eating Disorders of \$44,643 and \$53,427 for fiscal years 1999-00 34 and 2000-01 for the Department of Human Services.
