comprehensive substance abuse treatment program to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over juvenile justice issues.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

The Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and 12 Substance Abuse Services has \$1,230,150 budgeted in fiscal year 1999-00 for these substance abuse treatment programs. This 14 amount represents \$178,500 in General Fund appropriations and \$1,051,650 in Federal Expenditures Fund allocations. Since one 16 federal grant that currently supports these programs is expected to end on September 30, 2001, the department will require 18 additional General Fund appropriations of \$286,800 in fiscal year 2001-02 and \$409,550 annually beginning in fiscal year 2002-03 to 20 offset the loss of the federal funds in order to maintain the same level of support for these programs. 22

The Department of Corrections and the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services will incur some minor additional costs to prepare the required report. These costs can be absorbed within the departments' existing budgeted resources.'

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SUMMARY

32 The amendment directs the Department of Corrections and the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services, Office of Substance Abuse to continue to develop 34 and implement a comprehensive substance abuse treatment program 36 for juveniles committed to the Department of Corrections' The program must include screening, assessment and custody. treatment for all juveniles committed to a juvenile correctional 38 facility, 4 regional treatment networks, a targeted capacity 40 expansion program and 5 juvenile drug treatment courts. The program also must facilitate participation of the juvenile and 42 the juvenile's family and provide a system to monitor treatment progress and completion. 44

The amendment also requires the Department of Corrections 46 and the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services, Office of Substance Abuse to report 48 annually by March 1st their progress in implementing and funding the comprehensive substance abuse treatment program to the joint
