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Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

This amendment clarifies the intent of the bill to increase 8 the penalty for failure to yield the right-of-way to a visually impaired pedestrian. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to 10 the bill.
