Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2
4 Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §85, sub-§6 is enacted to read:

6 6. Ambulance operator course. Beginning January 1, 2002, a
8 person who routinely operates an ambulance that is being operated
10 in an emergency mode or transporting a patient must successfully
12 complete a basic ambulance vehicle operator course or a course
14 that has been approved by the board as an equivalent. This
16 requirement is in addition to any vehicle operator requirements
18 of Title 29-A or other provision of law.

SUMMARY

16 This bill requires a person who routinely operates an
18 ambulance to complete an ambulance operator course beginning
January 1, 2002.
