	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §1269 is enacted to read:
4	§1269. Life term of imprisonment for 2 prior convictions for
6	murder or Class A, B or C crimes
8	Notwithstanding this chapter or any other law, the court shall set a life term of imprisonment for a person who is
10	convicted of murder or a Class A, B or C crime if that person has
12	2 or more prior convictions for murder or a Class A, B or C crime. The sentence may not include a period of probation or any
14	other form of release from actual confinement.

18	The bill requires the court to set a life term of
20	imprisonment for a person who is convicted of murder or a Class A, B or C crime and has 2 prior convictions for murder or a Class A, B or C crime.
