3. Continuation. The tuition waiver provided by this chapter is awarded on a yearly basis and continues to be 2 available, if the person is otherwise eligible under this 4 section, as long as the person remains in good academic standing at a state postsecondary educational institution. 6 \$12573. Administration 8 1. Application. A person desiring a tuition waiver under 10 this chapter may apply to the authority for determination of eligibility. Application must be on forms and in a manner 12 prescribed by rule of the authority. Rules adopted pursuant to this chapter are routine technical rules as defined in the Maine 14 Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A. 16 2. Decision. The authority shall determine whether an applicant is eligible and notify the applicant. The authority 18 shall also notify the state postsecondary educational institution at which the person is accepted of the eligibility of that person 20 for a tuition waiver. Unless notified by the authority of a 22 change in the student's eligibility, the institution may not bill an eligible student for tuition during that school year. 24 **SUMMARY** 26 28 This bill provides a tuition waiver at state postsecondary educational institutions for persons 17 or 18 years of age who

30 have resided in foster care for at least one full year.
