Whereas,** the State of Maine is not obligated to adhere to the conditions set forth in international treaties that are not formally ratified by the United States Senate; and

Whereas, the United States Senate has not ratified the6conventions of the 1992 United Nations Framework Convention on
Climate Change, or the subsequent Kyoto Protocols on greenhouse8gas emissions; and

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10 Whereas, State Government agencies have participated in a task force on global climate change, which has recommended adherence to international goals for greenhouse gas emissions as set forth by the United Nations climate change conventions; and 14

Whereas, more than 17,000 scientists, two-thirds of whom have advanced degrees in physical sciences, have signed a petition asserting that "there is no convincing scientific evidence" that greenhouse gases are causing global warming; and

 Whereas, unilateral implementation of greenhouse gas emission controls by either the federal or state governments
would not significantly reduce greenhouse gases as long as the 136 developing nations are exempt from the Kyoto Protocols; and

Whereas, establishment of state policy based on unratified international treaties, such as those proposed for climate change and biological diversity, threatens the long-term economic health of many Maine industries; now, therefore, be it

30 Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Task Force to Investigate the Effect of Implementation by State Agencies of
32 Unratified International Treaties, referred to in this resolve as the "task force," is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the task force consists of 16 members appointed as follows:

38 1. One Democratic member of the State Senate appointed by the Senate President;

One Republican member of the State Senate appointed by
the Senate Republican leader;

44 3. Two Democratic members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House;

4. Two Republican members of the House of Representatives,48 appointed by the Republican floor leader;

5. One member of the Maine Taxpayers Party, appointed by 2 the chair of the Maine Taxpayers Party; One member of the Maine Libertarian Party, appointed by 6. the chair of the Maine Libertarian Party; 6 7. members from the Maine Conservation Two Rights Institute, appointed by the president of the Maine Conservation 8 Rights Institute; 10 Two members from Sovereignty International, appointed by 8. the president of Sovereignty International; 12 9. members from Unorganized Territories 14 Two United, appointed by the president of Unorganized Territories United; and 16 Two members from the Maine Property Rights Alliance, 10. 18 appointed by the president of the Maine Property Rights Alliance; and be it further 20 Sec. 3. Resolved: That the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the task 28 force within 30 days of the date that the last task force member is appointed; and be it further 30 32 Sec. 5. Chair. Resolved: That the members of the task force shall appoint a task force chair from among its members at the first meeting of the task force; and be it further 34 Sec. 6. Staff. Resolved: 36 That upon the approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide staff support to the task force; and be it further 38 Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That all members of the task 40 force are entitled to reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses, upon application to the Legislative Council. 42 The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall administer the task force's budget; and be it further 44 Sec. 8. Duties. Resolved: That the task force shall study the 46 effect of state agencies implementing international treaties that 48 have not been ratified by the United States Senate. In examining these issues, the task force shall: 50

Identify established and recommended state policies that 2 attempt to enforce the recommendations or goals of unratified international treaties, particularly those related to global 4 climate change and biological diversity; 2. Investigate the role of various state agencies in б studying, implementing or recommending implementation of the conditions set forth in unratified international treaties; 8 Estimate the economic and social effects of state 10 3. agencies' adoption of, or adherence to, the conditions of 12 unratified international treaties; and 14 4. Develop a final task force report, including, if necessary, recommended legislation that reflects the conclusions of the task force; and be it further 16 Sec. 9. Report.
