RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Provide 4-year Terms for Members of the Senate and the House of Representatives.

Presented by Representative CAMERON of Rumford. Cosponsored by Senator KIEFFER of Aroostook and Representative MURPHY of Berwick, Senator FERGUSON of Oxford. **Constitutional amendment. Resolved:** Two thirds of each 2 branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:

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Constitution, Art. II, §4 is amended to read:

Section 4. Time of state election; absentee voting. The election of Senators and members of the House of Representatives 8 shall be on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November ferever, except as provided in this section. 10 biennially Beginning with the general elections held in 2002, the elections 12 of Senators, members of the House of Representatives and the election-of Governor shall be on the Tuesday following the first 14 Monday of November every 4 years. The Legislature under proper enactment shall authorize and provide for voting by citizens of the State absent therefrom in the Armed Forces of the United 16 States or of this State and for voting by other citizens absent or physically incapacitated for reasons deemed sufficient. 18

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Constitution, Art. IV, Part First, §2 is amended to read:

22 Section 2. Number of Representatives; 4-year terms; division of the State into districts for House of Representatives. The House of Representatives shall consist of 24 151 members, to be elected by the qualified electors, and hold their office 2 4 years from the day next preceding the first 26 Wednesday in December following the general election. The 28 Legislature which convenes in 1983 and every 10th year thereafter shall cause the State to be divided into districts for the choice of Representative for each district. 30 one The number of Representatives shall be divided into the number of inhabitants 32 of the State exclusive of foreigners not naturalized according to the latest Federal Decennial Census or a State Census previously ordered by the Legislature to coincide with the Federal Decennial 34 to determine a mean population figure for Census, each Each Representative District shall be 36 Representative District. formed of contiguous and compact territory and shall cross 38 political subdivision lines the least number of times necessary establish as nearly as practicable equally populated to 40 districts. Whenever the population of a municipality entitles it to more than one district, all whole districts shall be drawn 42 within municipal boundaries. Any population remainder within the municipality shall be included in a district with contiguous 44 territory and shall be kept intact.

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Constitution, Art. IV, Part First, §5 is amended to read:

Section 5. Election of Representatives; lists of votes 2 delivered forthwith; lists of votes examined by Governor; summons of persons who appear to be elected; lists shall be laid before 4 The meetings within this State for the choice of the House. Representatives shall be warned in due course of law by qualified officials of the several towns and cities 7 days at least before 6 the election, and the election officials of the various towns and 8 cities shall preside impartially at such meetings, receive the votes of all the qualified electors, sort, count and declare them in open meeting; and a list of the persons voted for shall be 10 formed, with the number of votes for each person against that 12 person's name. Cities and towns belonging to any Representative District shall hold their meetings at the same time in the respective cities and towns; and such meetings shall be notified, 14 held and regulated, the votes received, sorted, counted and 16 declared in the same manner. Fair copies of the lists of votes shall be attested by the municipal officers and the clerks of the cities and towns and the city and town clerks respectively shall 18 cause the same to be delivered into the office of the Secretary 20 of State forthwith. The Governor shall examine the returned copies of such lists and 7 days before the first Wednesday of 22 December biennially following the general election, shall issue a summons to such persons as shall appear to have been elected by a plurality of all votes returned, to attend and take their seats. 24 All such lists shall be laid before the House of Representatives 26 on the first Wednesday of December biennially following the general election, and they shall finally determine who are 28 elected.

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Constitution, Art. IV, Part Second, §5 is amended to read:

32 Section 5. Determination of Senators elected; procedure for filling vacancies. The Senate shall, on said first Wednesday of 34 December, -- biennially following the general election, determine who is elected by a plurality of votes to be Senator in each 36 district. All vacancies in the Senate arising from death, resignation, removal from the State or like causes, and also 38 vacancies, if any, which may occur because of the failure of any district to elect by a plurality of votes the Senator to which 40 said district shall be entitled shall be filled by an immediate election in the unrepresented district. The Governor shall issue a proclamation therefor and therein fix the time of such election. 42

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Constitution, Art. IV, Part Third, §1 is amended to read:

 46 Section 1. To meet annually; power of Legislature to convene itself at other times; extent of legislative power. The
48 Legislature shall convene on the first Wednesday of December following the general election in what shall be designated the
50 first regular session of the Legislature; and shall further

convene on the first Wednesday after the first Tuesday of January 2 in the subsequent even-mumbered-year 3 years in what shall be designated the second, third and fourth regular session sessions 4 of the Legislature; provided, however, that the business of the second and fourth regular session sessions of the Legislature 6 shall be limited to budgetary matters; legislation in the Governor's call; legislation of an emergency nature admitted by the Legislature; legislation referred to committees for study and 8 report by the Legislature in the first or third regular session as the case may be; and legislation presented to the Legislature 10 by written petition of the electors under the provisions of Article IV, Part Third, Section 18. The Legislature shall enact 12 appropriate statutory limits on the length of the first and third 14 regular session sessions and of the second and fourth regular session sessions. The Legislature may convene at such other times on the call of the President of the Senate and Speaker of 16 the House, with the consent of a majority of the Members of the 18 Legislature of each political party, all Members of the Legislature having been first polled. The Legislature, with the 20 exceptions hereinafter stated, shall have full power to make and establish all reasonable laws and regulations for the defense and 22 benefit of the people of this State, not repugnant to this Constitution, nor to that of the United States.

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Constitution, Art. IV, Part Third, §18, sub-§1 is amended to read:

1. Petition procedure; petitions for direct initiative of 28 legislation. The electors may propose to the Legislature for its consideration any bill, resolve or resolution, including bills to 30 amend or repeal emergency legislation but not an amendment of the Constitution, State by written petition addressed to the Legislature or to either branch thereof and filed in the office 32 of the Secretary of State by the hour of 5:00 p.m., on or before 34 the 50th day after the date of convening of the Legislature in first and third regular session sessions or on or before the 25th day after the date of convening of the Legislature in second and 36 fourth regular session sessions. If the 50th or 25th day, 38 whichever applies, is a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, the period runs until the hour of 5:00 p.m., of the next day which is 40 not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday.

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Constitution, Art. V, Part Second, §1 is amended to read:

44 Section 1. Election. The Secretary of State shall be chosen biennially, at the first session and third regular
46 sessions of the Legislature, by joint ballot of the Senators and Representatives in convention.

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Constitution, Art. V, Part Third, §1 is amended to read:

2 Section 1. Election. The Treasurer shall be chosen biennially, at the first session and third regular sessions of ballot of the Legislature, by joint Senators, and 4 the Representatives in convention.

; and be it further

Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective 10 That the municipal officers of this State shall date. Resolved: notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding 12 a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of 14 this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question: 16

"Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine as proposed 18 by a resolution of the Legislature to change the term of office for State Legislators from 2 years to 4 years 20 beginning in 2002?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall 24 vote by ballot on this question, and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, 26 counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings 28 and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes 30 are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of the 32 Constitution on January 1, 2002; and be it further

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town 36 and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution 38 necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

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SUMMARY

This constitutional resolution changes Legislators' terms to 44 4 years following the general election in 2002. The Legislature 46 meets every year, but the business in the 4th year would be restricted as it is presently in the 2nd year.

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
