COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 509, L.D. 716, Bill, "An Act to Amend the Law Relating to School Construction and School Facilities"

Amend the bill by inserting after section 13 the following:

'Sec. 14. 30-A MRSA §5953-E, first ¶, as enacted by PL 1997, c. 787, §12, is amended to read:

There is established the Maine School Facilities Finance Program to promote efficient capital financing activities for the construction, renovation and maintenance of school facilities and the leasing-and lease-purchase of school facilities.'

Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 15 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 15. 30-A MRSA §6006-F, sub-§3, ¶B, as enacted by PL 1997, c. 787, §13, is amended to read:

B. To make loans to ~~refund bonds or notes of~~ a school administrative unit ~~issued for the purpose of financing any repair to finance expenditures incurred after June 1, 1998 for repairs or renovations~~ authorized under paragraph A and certified under subsection 5, ~~if sold after June 1, 1998;~~

Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

This amendment corrects a technical error in the Maine School Facilities Finance Program statutes and changes the authorization date in the School Revolving Renovation Fund statutes from April 30, 1998, as proposed in the bill, back to the original date of June 1, 1998.
