44	<b>1-A. Appointment; composition; term; compensation.</b> The Marine Resources Advisory Council, established by Title 5,
46	section 12004-G, subsection 27, consists of 15 members. The Chair of the Lobster Advisory Council is-an <u>and the chair of the</u>
48	Marine Recreational Fishing Advisory Council are ex officio member members of the council. Each other member is appointed by
50	the Governor and is subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over marine

resources and to confirmation by the Legislature. Seven members 2 must be persons who are licensed under this Part to engage in commercial harvesting activities. Those 7 members are selected 4 by the Governor from names recommended to the Governor by groups representing commercial harvesting interests. Each member must represent a different commercial harvesting activity, except that 6 none of those 7 members may represent lobster harvesters. The remaining 7 6 members must include one-person-who--represents 8 recreational--marine--fishing--interests, one public member, 4 10 persons who hold a nonharvesting-related license under this Part and one person representing the aquaculture industry. The Governor shall select the person to represent the aquaculture 12 industry from among the names recommended by the aquaculture 14 The composition of the council must reflect a industry. geographical distribution along the coast. All appointed members 16 are appointed for a term of 3 years, except a vacancy must be filled in the same manner as an original member for the unexpired 18 portion of the term. An appointed member may not serve for more than 2 consecutive terms. Appointed members serve until their 20 successors are appointed. The Chair of the Lobster Advisory Council and the chair of the Marine Recreational Fishing Advisory 22 Council shall serve until a new Chair of the Lobster Advisory Council <u>or a new chair of the Marine Recreational Fishing</u> Advisory Council, respectively, 24 is chosen. Members are compensated as provided in Title 5, chapter 379.'

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Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated 28 "**§6032.**" in the first paragraph in the last line (page 1, line 18 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "fund." the following: 30 'By February 1st of each year, the commissioner shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having 32 jurisdiction over marine resource matters on the amount of money collected in the fund and all expenditures made from the fund in 34 the previous fiscal year.'

36 Further amend the bill by inserting after section 1 the following:

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§6033. Marine Recreational Fishing Advisory Council

 Appointment: composition. The Marine Recreational
Fishing Advisory Council, referred to in this section as the "council" and established by Title 5, section 12004-I, subsection
57-D, consists of 9 members. The commissioner shall appoint the members as follows:

	A. Four members representing the State's recreational marine
2	<u>fisheries. These members must reflect a geographical</u> distribution along the coast;

6	B. Three members representing the party charter boat industry;
8	C. One member representing tackle shop owners; and
10	D. One member representing the commercial fishing industry.
12	2. Term. A council member serves for a 3-year term and
14	continues serving until a successor is duly appointed and gualified. An appointed member may not serve for more than 2
16	<u>consecutive terms. In the case of a vacancy, the commissioner</u> shall fill promptly the vacancy.
18	<b>3. Quorum.</b> A quorum is a majority of the current members of the council.
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22	4. Chair and officers. The council shall annually elect one of its members to serve as chair for a one-year term. The

26	5. Meetings. The council shall meet at least 4 times a year. It may also meet at other times at the call of the chair or the chair's designee or the commissioner or the commissioner's

46	Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 6033, subsection 2, the commissioner shall make initial

The Department of Marine Resources will incur some minor 2 additional costs to submit a required report to the Legislature. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing 4 budgeted resources.'

#### SUMMARY

This amendment requires the Commissioner of Marine Resources 10 to report annually to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over marine resource matters on 12 the amount of money collected in and all expenditures made from the Marine Recreation Fishing Conservation and Management Fund in 14 the previous fiscal year.

16 The amendment establishes the Marine Recreational Fishing Advisory Council to advise the commissioner on activities that 18 relate to marine recreational fishing and to make recommendations to the commissioner concerning expenditures from the Marine 20 Recreation Fishing Conservation and Management The Fund. amendment also replaces the current member of the Marine 22 Resources Advisory Council who represents recreational marine fishing interests with the chair of the Marine Recreational 24 Fishing Advisory Council. The amendment also adds an allocation section to the bill. Finally, the amendment adds a fiscal note 26 to the bill.

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
