22	CALL THE PARTY OF
24	1. Prohibition. A person may not use the title "paralegal" or "legal assistant" unless the person meets the definition in section 921, subsection 1.

28	2. Penalty. A person who violates subsection 1 commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture of not more than \$1000 may be adjudged.

32	SUMMARY
34	This bill protects consumers by requiring any person who
36	uses the title "paralegal" or "legal assistant" to meet certain requirements. Those requirements are two-fold:
38	1. Qualified by education, training or work experience; and
40	2. Supervised by an attorney to the extent that the attorney is ultimately responsible for the work.

44	A person who claims to be a paralegal or a legal assistant and does not meet the statutory definition commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture of up to \$1000 may be adjudged.
