COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 518, L.D. 725

'FISCAL NOTE

The Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services will incur some minor additional costs to conduct the study. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill, changing it to a resolve. 14 It requires the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services to study the confidentiality of 16 information regarding persons receiving services funded in whole or in part by the department and report its findings and any 18 recommended legislation to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services by December 1, 2000. The study must include participation from consumers 20 and providers of services, Legislators and local service networks. The study must consider 22 the requirements of professional ethical standards and state and federal laws, rules and regulations. The amendment adds a fiscal 24 note.
