28	Further amend the bill in section 1 in the indented paragraph in the 3rd line (page 1, line 7 in L.D.) by striking
30	the following: "county." and inserting in its place the following: 'county, except for Piscataguis County. State
32	ownership of land in Piscataguis County may not exceed the acreage owned by the State on July 1, 1999.'
34	Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

38	FISCAL NOTE
40	This bill, establishing certain limits on the amounts of
42	land that may be held by the State and municipalities, may prohibit the future acquisition of particular pieces of property
44	or interests in property by the State and municipalities. The net fiscal impact of these limitations on the operations of State Covernment and municipalities can not be determined at this time

Department. The collection of additional filing fees may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

SUMMARY

The State currently owns in excess of 10% of the land in 10 Piscataquis County. This amendment would allow the State to continue ownership in excess of 10% in that county, but it could 12 not increase its acres of ownership. The amendment provides a section headnote for the new provision and adds a fiscal note to 14 the bill.
