Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §4315, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1997, c. 511, §23, is further amended to read:

6 1. Transportation of wild blueberries without permit. It is unlawful for a person to transport wild blueberries in exceeding 25 pounds without first obtaining 8 quantities а transportation permit on an official form to be furnished by the 10 Wild Blueberry Commission of Maine. The Wild Blueberry upon request Commission of Maine shall issue official 12 transportation permit forms to ewners-whe shippers and processors certified under section 4305. Shippers and processors may issue the transportation permits to individuals owners or owner's 14 transportation agents with written authorization from owners. Each permit issued must bear a different number and expire at the 16 end of the calendar year. When an-owner a shipper or processor issues a transportation permit, the ewner shipper or processor 18 shall immediately send a copy to the Wild Blueberry Commission of 20 The commission shall keep a permanent record of all Maine. permits issued. The commission may--adopt--rules--establishing shall establish the form and content of transportation permits 22 and--geverning--the--means--ef--their--issuance and establishing 24 establish the record-keeping functions requirements of the commission and----the---ewners, shippers and processors. Notwithstanding any provision of Title 1, chapter 13, subchapter 26 I to the contrary, records pertaining to transportation permits required to be kept by the Wild Blueberry Commission of Maine 28 under this section are confidential to the extent necessary to 30 identity of parties to individual business preserve the The confidential status does not apply when transactions. 32 records kept by the Wild Blueberry Commission of Maine are needed as evidence in any proceeding to enforce any provision of section 4314 or this section, or in any prosecution for a violation of 34 any other criminal law. This subsection does not apply to wild 36 blueberries that have been received by a certified shipper or processor and have been weighed, logged into a permanent 38 record-keeping system and reloaded onto a vehicle for shipping under a bill of lading.

SUMMARY

44 This bill discourages the theft of wild blueberries by strengthening the laws concerning the illegal transportation of 46 blueberries by extending liability from owners alone to any shipper or processor, limiting issuance of transportation permits 48 to owners or owners' transportation agents and requiring the Wild Blueberry Commission of Maine to establish and administer the form and record-keeping requirements of transportation permits.
The bill does not apply to shipments of wild blueberries that have been received by a shipper or processor, logged into a
record-keeping system and reloaded into a vehicle for shipping under a bill of lading.
