20	Processing the fingerprint-based background checks will increase fee collections. The estimated increases of dedicated revenue to the Department of Public Safety are \$735,000 and		
22	\$392,000 in fiscal years 1999-00 and 2000-01, respectively.		
24	The additional costs associated with providing written confirmation to the requester if fingerprints are removed from		
26	the fingerprint file can be absorbed by the Department of Public Safety utilizing existing budgeted resources.'

30	SUMMARY		
32	This amendment specifies that teachers or other educational personnel required to have fingerprints taken pursuant to the		
34	Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 6103 may request that those fingerprints be removed from the State Bureau of		
36	Identification's file if the requester's certification, authorization or approval has expired and the requester has not		
38	applied for renewal. Upon receiving the request, the State Bureau of Identification shall remove the fingerprints from the		
40	file. The amendment also clarifies that the applicant or any		
42	other entity required by law is responsible for paying a one-time \$25 processing fee when the Department of Public Safety takes the applicant's fingerprints. The fee is used to offset the		
44	department's costs. The amendment also adds an allocation section and a fiscal note to the bill.
