An Act to Amend the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission Laws to Prohibit Fines on First-time Violators of Maine Land Use Regulation Commission Laws or Rules.

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §685-C, sub-§8, as amended by PL 1987, c. 816, Pt. KK, §12, is further amended to read:

- 8. Enforcement, inspection and penalties for violations. Standards, rules and orders issued by the commission pursuant to this chapter shall have the force and effect of law. No A development may not be undertaken, except in conformance with this chapter, the standards, rules and orders enacted or issued pursuant to this chapter, and any real estate or personal property existing in violation of such shall-be is a nuisance. For the purposes of inspection and to assure compliance with standards, orders and permits issued or adopted by the commission, authorized commission staff, forest rangers and the state supervisor or consultant personnel may conduct such investigations, examinations, tests and site evaluations deemed determined necessary to verify information presented to it, and may obtain access to any lands and structures regulated pursuant to this chapter.
- Any person who violates any provision of this chapter, or the terms or conditions of any standards, rules, permits or orders adopted or issued pursuant to this chapter, is subject to a civil penalty, payable to the State, of not more than \$10,000 for each day of the violation. The commission may not fine first-time violators unless their conduct was willful. The commission shall work with the violators to correct any environmental damage that may have occurred and to ensure that no further environmental damage occurs.
- 32 In addition to the other penalties provided, the commission may, in the name of the State of Maine, institute any appropriate action, injunction or other proceeding to prevent, restrain, 34 correct or abate any violation hereef of this subsection or of the orders or standards or rules premulgated-hereunder adopted 36 under this subsection. This action may include, but is not limited to, proceedings to revoke or suspend any commission 38 permit or approval, taken either before the commission itself in 40 accordance with Title 5, section 10004, before the Administrative Court in accordance with Title 4, sections 1152 to 1157, or, 42 notwithstanding the provisions of Title 4, section 1151, subsection 2, or Title 5, section 10051, before the Superior Court as part of an enforcement action brought by the commission. 44
- In addition to any such penalties or remedies provided in this subsection, the court may order restoration of any area affected by any action or inaction found to be in violation of any of the provisions of this chapter or of any order, standard, rule or permit of the commission, or any decree of the court, to the

condition of such area prior to the violation. When such restoration is not practicable, the court may order other actions to be taken by the person charged with the violation, which are in mitigation of the damage caused by the violation.

A person who willfully or knowingly falsifies any statement contained in a permit application or other information required to be submitted to the commission shall-be is in violation of this chapter and subject to the penalties of this chapter.

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### 12 SUMMARY

The purpose of this bill is to prohibit the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission from fining a first-time violator of the commission rules and to require the commission to help the violator remedy the environmental damage that may have occurred.
