Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2388, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read:

1. Violation. Except as otherwise provided, an operator who violates a provision of this subchapter commits a traffic infraction for which a forfeiture of not less than \$25 nor more than \$1,000 for each offense may be adjudged. Each person, including the owner of a mobile home and the driver, who moves a mobile home without a permit issued pursuant to section 2382, subsection 10 commits a traffic infraction for which a forfeiture of \$250 must be adjudged. Credible evidence that the mobile home was moved is sufficient to prove a violation of section 2382, subsection 10 even if there is no direct witness to the event.

SUMMARY

This bill makes the traffic infraction of moving a mobile home when taxes are unpaid on the mobile home punishable by a forfeiture of \$250. The bill also allows evidence that the mobile home was moved as sufficient to prove a violation even if there was no direct witness to the event.
