2	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7406, sub-§20, ¶B, as repealed and replaced
4	by PL 1981, c. 414, §27, is amended to read:
6	B. The following are exceptions concerning subsection 17.
8	(1) Paragraphs A, B, C, D, E and F do not apply to military organizations authorized by law to bear arms
10	or to the National Guard in the performance of its duty.

	(2) Paragraphs B, D and E do not apply to firearms
14	using the .22 caliber rim fire cartridge or to any autoloading pistol having a barrel less than 8 inches
16	in length.
18	(3) Paragraph K does not affect or restrict the legitimate possession, use and sale of flashlights with
20	a maximum power equivalent to 2 D-cell batteries.
22	(4) Paragraph L does not affect chapter 709, subchapter IV, er any rule issued in accordance with
24	section 7035, subsection 1 or the legitimate possession and use of flashlights with a maximum power equivalent
