COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A " to S.P. 275, L.D. 793, Bill, "An Act to Confine Tribal Gaming to the Reservation of the Licensed Organization"

Amend the bill by inserting after section 1 the following:

'Sec. 2. Application. This Act applies to games conducted on or after the effective date of this Act, regardless of whether a license application to conduct games on Indian territory other than the reservation is pending on or granted on or prior to the effective date of the Act.'

SUMMARY

This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary. It clarifies that the bill prohibits high-stakes beano games at any location other than Indian reservation lands, beginning on the effective date of the new law, regardless of whether a license has been issued or is pending to grant authority to conduct high-stakes beano on land other than Indian reservation land.
