Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §1502, 4th ¶, as amended by PL 1993, c. 123, §1, is further amended to read:

The State Police may provide assistance to federal agencies, municipalities and counties. The Chief of the State Police may charge the various federal agencies, municipalities and counties for these services. Revenues received from these agencies, municipalities and counties must be allocated for the purpose of funding the cost of providing the services.
