respectively, for the Workers' Compensation Board for the salary, benefits, operating and start-up costs of 2 Paralegal Assistant positions and one Auditor II position.

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Increasing the assessment limit of the board will result in additional dedicated revenue of as much as \$135,000 annually beginning in fiscal year 1999-00.'

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10 SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill. It provides for the addition of one auditor and 2 paralegal assistant positions to the Workers' Compensation Board, instead of providing for 9 paralegal positions. It also provides for a cap of \$6,735,000 on the assessments against insurers and self-insurers instead of \$7,000,000, as provided in the bill. Finally, the amendment replaces the allocation section and adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
