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Sec. 1. 24 MRSA §2332-J is enacted to read:

§2332-J. Certified nurse practitioners and certified nurse midwives as primary care providers

With respect to managed care plans that require subscribers to select primary care physicians, a nonprofit hospital and medical service organization that issues individual and group contracts must permit a certified nurse practitioner or certified nurse midwife to serve as a primary care provider for services provided within the scope of the certified nurse practitioner's or certified nurse midwife's license, regardless of whether the certified nurse practitioner or certified nurse midwife is under the supervision of a physician, subject to reasonable credentialing standards established by the organization.

Sec. 2. 24-A MRSA §2756 is enacted to read:

§2756. Certified nurse practitioners and certified nurse midwives as primary care providers

With respect to managed care plans that require individuals to select primary care physicians, an insurer that issues individual contracts must permit a certified nurse practitioner or certified nurse midwife to serve as a primary care provider for services provided within the scope of the certified nurse practitioner's or certified nurse midwife's license, regardless of whether the certified nurse practitioner or certified nurse midwife is under the supervision of a physician, subject to reasonable credentialing standards established by the insurer.

Sec. 3. 24-A MRSA §2847-G is enacted to read:

§2847-G. Certified nurse practitioners and certified nurse midwives as primary care providers

With respect to managed care plans that require individual group members to select primary care physicians, an insurer that issues group contracts must permit a certified nurse practitioner or certified nurse midwife to serve as a primary care provider for services provided within the scope of the certified nurse practitioner's or certified nurse midwife's license, regardless of whether the certified nurse practitioner or certified nurse midwife is under the supervision of a physician, subject to reasonable credentialing standards established by the insurer.

Sec. 4. 24-A MRSA §4245 is enacted to read:

§4245. Certified nurse practitioners and certified nurse midwives as primary care providers

With respect to managed care plans that require enrollees to select primary care physicians, a health maintenance organization that issues individual and group contracts must permit a certified nurse practitioner or certified nurse midwife to serve as a primary care provider for services provided within the scope of the certified nurse practitioner's or certified nurse midwife's license, regardless of whether the certified nurse practitioner or certified nurse midwife is under the supervision of a physician, subject to reasonable credentialing standards established by the health maintenance organization.

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SUMMARY

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This bill allows certified nurse practitioners and certified nurse midwives participating in managed care plans to serve as primary care providers.
