This bill requires the State Planning Office to be directly responsible to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government instead of to the Governor. It changes the appointment of the director of the State Planning Office to include consideration by the committee on state and local government and confirmation by the Legislature. Under the provisions of this bill, reports by the State Planning Office will be presented annually to the committee on state and local government and include detailed information about money allocated to and spent by the office. This bill changes the scheduled date that the committee on state and local government reviews the State Planning Office from the year 2005 to 2001.
