An Act to Amend the Pulling Event Laws.

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

б	2. Statutory rules. No \underline{A} permit may <u>not</u> be issued unless the sponsor has adopted the following rules governing the conduct

10	A. All teamsters who are to compete in contests shall have their teams ready at the published starting time. All
12	classes shall <u>must</u> be closed after the positions are drawn. Classes shall <u>must</u> start as nearly as possible to the
14	published time.
16	B. Check weighing will be allowed prior to the official weigh-in. All weighing shall must be done in the forenoon
18	if possible. The-official-weigh-in-shall-start-not-earlier than3heurs-norlater-thanl-1/2hours-beferethe-first
20	elass-ofthe-day-starts. Immediately prior to the official weighing, all teams must be offered fresh water under the
22	supervision of the superintendent or assistant superintendent. The superintendent may not weigh any thin,
24	<u>dehydrated, apparently sick or lame animals or animals with open sores.</u> Teams must have on halters and shoes.
26	C. Measuring shall must be in a straight line to the
28	nearest point on the drag. Line-to-line measuring will-be <u>is</u> allowed. The front of the drag must touch the line
30	before turning. To get the full-line measure, the drag must be turned more than 1/2 way.
32	D. Teams shall must stay hooked to the drag at all times.
34	Neunhitching <u>Unhitching</u> and rehitching maybe <u>is not</u> allowed.

38	E. An actual separation, breaking or bending of equipment shall-constitute <u>constitutes</u> a breakdown. Any team breaking down may take the distance pulled or return to the last
40	position and pull over. Only one breakdown maybe is allowed.
42	F. Time limits shall-be <u>are a maximum of</u> 5 minutes waless
44	etherwise-agreed-upen-by-teamsters. Time starts when the drag is moved. The time limit to hook on in distance pulls
46	shall-be <u>is</u> 3 minutes.
48	G. On horses, the very light use of the reins on the hind quarters only <u>is allowed</u> and no over and under may-be <u>is not</u>
50	allowed. Full arm swing is not allowed. No-whip Whips,

brads or goads may-be <u>are not</u> allowed. Reins shall <u>may</u> not be doubled up. No--electrical <u>Electrical</u> or electronic devices may-be <u>are not</u> allowed. No-open <u>Open</u> bridles may-be <u>are not</u> allowed. Ponies shall <u>must</u> not be struck except in a sweepstakes when they may be struck with a cap or bare open hand.

8 On oxen, the use of the goad shall must be very light. A full arm swing is not allowed. The goad shall may not have ne a brad in it, only a plain yoke and chain or pole that 10 may be pulled. All chains shall must be covered to the hook. Ne-plastie Plastic goads may-be are not allowed. 12 The goad stick must not be over 4 feet long and must not exceed 1/2 inch in diameter on the small end. The goad stick may 14 be taped with friction tape but not weighted. The stick may 16 be used lightly on the face to control the oxen but not around the eyes.

H. Any number of helpers will--be are allowed to help
hitch. After hitch-on, there shall may be only one helper. The helper shall stay behind the drag unless needed to help
the teamster with snarls or turns. On oxen, the helper must shall stay behind the drag at all times after hitch-on. The
helper shall may not have a stick.

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I. All participants shall be properly dressed. Proper language must be used at all times. Any participant under the influence of liquor shall must be disqualified from the contest. Tests may be made to determine intoxication. The drinking of intoxicating beverages by participants in and around the ring is prohibited.

J. The splitting of teams shall-be is decided by the fair association or other sponsor.

It clarifies humane treatment of animals used in these events. It empowers humane agents to work with pulling event superintendents 48 to enforce laws. 50

The bill also changes the composition of the Pull Events 2 Commission and amends positions appointed by organizations that no longer exist.
