#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 5 MRSA c. 151-B is amended by repealing the chapter headnote and enacting in its place the following:

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#### CHAPTER 151-B

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### CONSENSUS REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE FORECASTING

Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §1710, first ¶, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 368, Pt. J, §1, is amended to read:

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The Consensus Economic Forecasting Commission established by 5, section 12004-I, subsection 29-B, to provide the Governor, the Legislature and \_ the Revenue Forecasting Committee and the Expenditure Forecasting Committee with analyses, findings recommendations representing state economic assumptions relevant to revenue and expenditure forecasting, and referred to in this chapter as the "commission," consists of 5 members appointed as follows: two members appointed by the Governor; one member recommended for appointment to the Governor by President of the Senate; one member recommended for appointment to the Governor by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and one member appointed by the other members of the commission. One of the 5 members must be selected by a majority vote of the committee members to serve as the chair of the commission. Commission members must be appointed within 15 days of the effective date of this section and serve until January 1997. Thereafter, the commission members are appointed in January of odd-numbered years. A member may not be a Legislator or an employee of the Executive Department, the Legislature or the Department. Each commission member must professional credentials and demonstrated expertise in economic forecasting.

Sec. 3. 5 MRSA §1710-A, sub-§§2 and 3, as amended by PL 1997, c. 643, Pt. W, §1, are further amended to read:

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Biennial economic assumptions. The commission shall submit recommendations for state economic assumptions for the next fiscal biennium and analyze economic assumptions for the current fiscal biennium, which must be approved by a majority of the commission members. No later than November 1st of each even-numbered year, the commission shall submit to the Governor, the Legislative Council, the Revenue Forecasting Committee, the Expenditure Forecasting Committee and the joint standing committee οf Legislature the having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs a report that presents the analyses, findings and recommendations for economic assumptions related to revenue and expenditure forecasting for the next fiscal biennium. In its report, the commission shall fully describe the methodology employed in reaching its recommendations.

3. Current biennium adjustments. No later than February lst and November 1st annually the commission shall submit to the Governor, the Legislative Council, the Revenue Forecasting Committee, the Expenditure Forecasting Committee and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs a report that presents the commission's findings and recommendations for adjustments to the economic assumptions for the current fiscal biennium. In each report the commission shall fully describe the methodology employed in reaching its recommendations.

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Sec. 4. 5 MRSA §1710-E, as amended by PL 1997, c. 655, §4, is further amended to read:

#### §1710-E. Revenue Forecasting Committee; established; membership

There is established the Revenue Forecasting Committee, referred-to--in-this-chapter--as--the-"committee," for the purpose of providing the Governor, the Legislature and the State Budget Officer with analyses, findings and recommendations relating to the projection of revenues for the General Fund and the Highway Fund based on economic assumptions recommended by the Consensus Economic Forecasting Commission. The eemmittee Revenue Forecasting Committee includes the State Budget Officer, the State Tax Assessor, the State Economist and \_ an economist on the faculty of the University of Maine System selected by the chancellor, the Director of the Office of Fiscal and Program Review and an analyst from the Office of Fiscal and Program Review designated selected by the director of that office. of the 6 members must be selected by a majority vote of the eemmittee Revenue Forecasting Committee members to serve as the chair of the semmittee Revenue Forecasting Committee.

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Sec. 5. 5 MRSA §1710-F, as amended by PL 1997, c. 157, §1, is further amended to read:

#### §1710-F. Duties of Revenue Forecasting Committee

- 1. Duties; use of economic assumptions. The semmittee Revenue Forecasting Committee shall develop current fiscal biennium and 2 ensuing fiscal biennia revenue projections using the economic assumptions recommended by the Consensus Economic Forecasting Commission.
- 2. Biennial revenue projections. The committee Revenue Forecasting Committee shall submit recommendations for state revenue projections for the next 2 fiscal biennia and analyze

- revenue projections for the current fiscal biennium, which must be approved by a majority of the committee Revenue Forecasting 2 later than December 1st Committee members. No of each even-numbered year, the semmittee Revenue Forecasting Committee shall submit to the Governor, the Legislative Council, the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs and the State Budget Officer a report that presents the analyses, findings and recommendations 8 for General Fund and Highway Fund revenue projections for the In its report the committee Revenue 10 next 2 fiscal biennia.   - 3. Current and ensuing biennium adjustments. No later than March 1st and December 1st annually the semmittee Revenue shall submit Forecasting Committee to the Governor, joint standing committee of Legislative Council, the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs and the State Budget Officer a report that presents the analyses, findings and recommendations for adjustments to General Fund revenue and Highway Fund revenue for the current and ensuing fiscal biennia. In each report the semmittee Revenue Forecasting Committee shall fully describe the methodology employed in reaching its recommendations. Revenue adjustments for other funds of the State may be included in the report at the discretion of the semmittee Revenue Forecasting Committee.
    - Sec. 6. 5 MRSA §1710-G, as amended by PL 1997, c. 655, §5, is further amended to read:

#### §1710-G. Use of revenue forecasts

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The State Budget Officer shall use the revenue projections recommended by the semmittee Revenue Forecasting Committee in setting revenue estimates in accordance with section 1665, subsection 3. The State Budget Officer shall use the revenue projections of the semmittee Revenue Forecasting Committee in preparing General Fund and Highway Fund revenue and expenditure forecasts in accordance with section 1664 and section 1665, subsection 7. If new information becomes available and the State Budget Officer wishes to recommend an adjustment to the revenue projections already recommended by the eemmittee Forecasting Committee, the State Budget Officer shall convene a meeting of the semmittee Revenue Forecasting Committee as soon as practicable so that the semmittee Revenue Forecasting Committee may review any new data and make any additional recommendations it feels necessary.

## §1710-J-1. Expenditure Forecasting Committee: established: membership

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There is established the Expenditure Forecasting Committee for the purpose of providing the Governor, the Legislature and

the State Budget Officer with analyses, findings and 2 recommendations relating to the projection of expenditures for the General Fund and the Highway Fund based on economic 4 assumptions recommended by the Consensus Economic Forecasting Commission. The Expenditure Forecasting Committee includes the 6 State Budget Officer, the State Economist, another employee of the executive branch selected by the Governor, an economist on the faculty of the University of Maine System selected by the 8 chancellor, the Director of the Office of Fiscal and Program 10 Review and an analyst from the Office of Fiscal and Program Review selected by the director of that office. One of the 6 12 members must be selected by a majority vote of the Expenditure Forecasting Committee members to serve as the chair of the 14 Expenditure Forecasting Committee.

### \$1710-J-2. Duties of Expenditure Forecasting Committee

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- 1. Duties: use of economic assumptions. The Expenditure Forecasting Committee shall develop current fiscal biennium and 2 ensuing fiscal biennia expenditure projections using the economic assumptions recommended by the Consensus Economic Forecasting Commission.
- 2. Biennial expenditure projections. The Expenditure 24 Forecasting Committee shall submit recommendations for state appropriations and allocations for the next 2 fiscal biennia and 26 analyze expenditure projections for the current fiscal biennium, 28 which must be approved by a majority of the Expenditure Forecasting Committee members. No later than December 15th of 30 each even-numbered year, the Expenditure Forecasting Committee shall submit to the Governor, the Legislative Council, the joint 32 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs and the State Budget Officer 34 a report that presents the analyses, findings and recommendations for General Fund and Highway Fund appropriations and allocations for the next 2 fiscal biennia. In its report the Expenditure 36 Forecasting Committee shall fully describe the methodology 38 employed in reaching its recommendations. Allocation recommendations for other funds of the State may be included in the report at the discretion of the Expenditure Forecasting 40 Committee.

3. Current and ensuing biennium adjustments. No later than
March 15th and December 15th annually the Expenditure Forecasting
Committee shall submit to the Governor, the Legislative Council,
the joint standing committee of the Legislature having
jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs and the
State Budget Officer a report that presents the analyses,
findings and recommendations for adjustments to General Fund
appropriations and Highway Fund allocations for the current and

ensuing fiscal biennia. In each report the Expenditure Forecasting Committee shall fully describe the methodology employed in reaching its recommendations. Allocation adjustments for other funds of the State may be included in the report at the discretion of the Expenditure Forecasting Committee.

#### \$1710-J-3. Use of expenditure forecasts

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The State Budget Officer shall use the expenditure projections of the Expenditure Forecasting Committee in preparing General Fund and Highway Fund revenue and expenditure forecasts in accordance with section 1664 and section 1665, subsection 7. If new information becomes available and the State Budget Officer wishes to recommend an adjustment to the expenditure projections already recommended by the Expenditure Forecasting Committee, the State Budget Officer shall convene a meeting of the Expenditure Forecasting Committee as soon as practicable so that the Expenditure Forecasting Committee may review any new data and make any additional recommendations it feels necessary.

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#### \$1710-J-4. Meetings

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The Expenditure Forecasting Committee shall meet at least 4 times a year. Additional meetings may be called by a majority vote of the Expenditure Forecasting Committee or by the State Budget Officer as specified in section 1710-J-3.

\$1710-J-5. Staffing

The Expenditure Forecasting Committee may receive staff assistance from the Bureau of the Budget, the State Planning Office and, at the discretion of the Legislature, the Office of Fiscal and Program Review. The Expenditure Forecasting Committee may also utilize other professionals having expenditure forecasting, economic and fiscal expertise.

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#### \$1710-J-6. Access to information

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In order to assist the Expenditure Forecasting Committee, all departments and agencies shall provide information and data to the committee on request.

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#### SUMMARY

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This bill establishes an Expenditure Forecasting Committee in order to provide the executive and legislative branches with analyses, findings and recommendations related to the projection of expenditures for the General Fund, Highway Fund and other funds of State Government. The committee is modelled on the Revenue Forecasting Committee, originally established in statute in 1995.

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This bill also makes technical changes to the authorizing legislation of the Consensus Economic Forecasting Commission and the Revenue Forecasting Committee so as to clarify their relationship to the Economic Forecasting Committee.
