	Sec. 2. Limitation. If funds are not appropriated to the
14	Department of Education to carry out the purposes of this Act,
	the department is not responsible for the expense of obtaining
16	criminal history records and fingerprinting for any person applying for renewal of certification, authorization or approval.

20	SUMMARY
22	This bill requires certain applicants for initial certification, authorization or approval as school employees to
24	pay for the expenses involved in undergoing fingerprinting and obtaining criminal history records. The bill also requires that
26	the State pay the expense of obtaining fingerprints and criminal
	history records for any person renewing their certification,
28	authorization or approval. If funds are not appropriated to the
	Department of Education to pay the expense of fingerprinting and
30	obtaining criminal history records for any person's renewal, the department is not responsible for paying this expense.
