2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

16	Sec. 1. Exemption from reformulated gasoline sales. The Governor shall petition the United States Environmental Protection Agency
18	to remove by July 1, 1999 all counties in this State from the list of counties in the United States that must use reformulated
