2 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
as emergencies; and

6 Whereas, there are immediate environmental and public health
hazards from the use of reformulated gas; and

8 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
10 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
12 safety; now, therefore,

14 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

16 **Sec. 1. Exemption from reformulated gasoline sales.** The Governor
shall petition the United States Environmental Protection Agency
18 to remove by July 1, 1999 all counties in this State from the
list of counties in the United States that must use reformulated
20 gasoline.

22 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the
24 preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.
