	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
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4	Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §3913, sub-§6, as amended by PL 1997, c. 690, §11, is repealed.
6	Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §3913, sub-§6-A and 6-B are enacted to read:
8	<u>6-A. Euthanasia for severely sick or severely injured dog.</u> A humane agent, an animal control officer or an animal shelter
. 10	within the State may authorize in writing immediate euthanasia of a severely sick or severely injured dog upon determining that the
12	following conditions are met:
14	A. The clerk or animal control officer of the municipality where the dog was found has been notified of the dog's
16	presence and the owner of the dog, if known, has been notified; and
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20	<u>B. A veterinarian states in writing that the dog's recovery from its injury or illness, given reasonable time and reasonable care, is doubtful.</u>
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	Notwithstanding paragraphs A and B, a veterinarian may authorize
24	immediate euthanusia if, in the veterinarian's judgment, there is no possibility of recovery for a severely injured or sick animal.
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	<u>6-B. Euthanasia for extremely vicious dog or dog that</u>
28	causes serious bodily injury. A humane agent, an animal control officer or an animal shelter within the State may authorize in
30	writing immediate euthanasia for an extremely vicious dog or dog
	that causes serious bodily injury upon determining that the
32	following conditions are met:
34	A. The clerk or animal control officer of the municipality where the dog was found has been notified of the dog's
36	presence and the owner of the dog, if known, has been notified; and

	B. A veterinarian, an animal control officer or law
40	<u>enforcement officer states in writing that the dog while not on a leash or under the control of its owner caused serious</u>
42	bodily injury to a child 12 years of age or younger or that the dog presents a danger to the public.
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	The owner of a dog euthanized in accordance with this subsection
46	is responsible for all expenses incurred by the victim of the dog and incurred by any official, facility or municipality in the
48	operation of this subsection.
50	Sec. 3. 7 MRSA §3913, sub-§7, as amended by PL 1997, c. 690, §11, is further amended to read:
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52	7. Immunity from civil liability. A veterinarian, a humane
54	agent, an animal control officer or an animal shelter is not

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civilly liable to any party for authorization made in accordance with subsection--6 subsections 6-A or 6-B nor is any person performing euthanasia under that authorization.

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## SUMMARY

8 This bill authorizes the immediate euthanasia for a dog that while not on a leash or under control of the dog's owner, causes 10 serious bodily injury to a child 12 years of age or younger. This bill requires the owner of the dog to pay all expenses 12 incurred by the victim of the dog and for the costs of the euthanasia.
